Our Club joined the ever-growing world of cyber runners when the website for The Greater Pittsburgh Road Runners Club went live in May 2000.

Our mission is to share the news and philosophy of the GPRRC and to promote running in general in Western Pennsylvania.

In our first month we had 50 visitors. However, we are currently counting between 500 and 600 visits a month with the largest number, 700 visits, occurring in December 2001.

Highlights of the site include essays by our members, the GPRRC race calendar with maps to the race sites, results and pictures from the races, and a comprehensive page of links to running organizations and resources, including that of our parent group The Road Runners Club of America.

We welcome input from all members of GPRRC on content for the site. The website is updated several times a

rouj by winning in 3:49.92 for the fastest-ever outdoor mile on U. S. Soil.

The women's world record for the marathon was broken twice — first by Naoko Takahashi on September 30 in Berlin with a time of 2:19:47 and then on October 7 in Chicago by Catherine Ndereba with a time of 2:18:47

Of course most of us know that if we were as young as these outstanding runners we would also probably be setting records. But looking to the future there are some recent records that we can target for ourselves. Some examples are:

Gerry Davidson, age 80, ran the mile in 9:00.52 to establish a new record for a woman over 80. John Keston, age 76, set a number of world or age group records — 6:27.81 for the mile, 41:59.06 10K on a track, 42:21 10K on the road and became the oldest man to run a sub-3:30 marathon at 3:22:59.

There are other kinds of records you can aim for or establish for your self. Some examples are: Ron Hill, age 63, of Manchester England has not missed a day of running since December 21, 1964 or more than 13,000 days. Locally, Don Slusser has a similar record. Jack Kirk, age 94, of Mariposa, CA has completed 66 straight Dipsea 7.1 mile races. Locally we have quite a few runners who completed all 25 Great Races and could by age 94 exceed 66 straight completed races.

Ron Hill sets a world record every day and Don Slusser also sets a record every day. Jack Kirk sets a new record very year. I'll bet each of us can set goal that will keep us running for a long time.

In addition to keeping his daily run streak going, Ron Hill has another goal which is to race in 100 countries before he turns age 70. He's already competed in 70 countries.

Happy New Year and may all your runs be enjoyable.

Ironman Triathlon

Bill Hoon finally finished the Hawaiian Ironman.

The race was on October 6th and the day was just as windy as it was last year for him. Winds were officially clocked on the bicycle course at 50 mph. Just try riding a bicycle in that much wind.

The 2.4 mile swim was first, of course, and it was largely uneventful, if not crowded, until the last 1/4 mile for Bill. He'd been drafting a woman for over 1 1/2 miles at that point and was looking forward to finishing with her. Another woman tried to horn in on his position and when he wouldn't give way, she gave him one hell of a wallop to the jaw. He briefly saw stars and then plowed on ahead with his companion.

Then it was on to the 112 mile bicycle race and those horrendous winds. There were 2 serious accidents that Bill was aware of. One woman broke her arm after being blown over and another woman broke her pelvis. Bill admits to some serious swearing as he was blown around on the course. He was blown off the road, at one point,

when he attempted to take a drink of water during what he thought was a lull in the wind. He says that trying to get your feet out of the cleats when you're swerving in gravel and have no idea which way the bike is going to go, is no fun at all.

Bill had to race walk the marathon this year due to a torn meniscus in his right knee. He didn't do all that poorly, actually. His time for the 26.2 miles was 6:23:54 and part of that was in a rip roaring down-pour.

He was quite happy with what he had one that day and ended up with the following times: 1:40:04 for the swim, 8:04:12 for the bike, and 6:23:54 for the marathon. His finish time was 16:23:12. Hardly even exciting, he says. He'd love to go back someday to compete in this race uninjured.

Editor's note

As you may remember from the article in the December 2000 issue of the newsletter, the Ironman finish line is closed at the 17 hour mark. In October 2000 Bill missed the cut-off by approximately 12 minutes. This was because Bill had spent 45 minutes during the bike segment using his training in trauma care to assist a woman who had been blown off of her bicycle and sustained what appeared to be a serious head injury. Although it was not as serious as first thought, the woman did have a mild concussion, required 20 stitches in her face and also broke her clavicle (collar bone).

We are all proud of Bill and are very happy that he was finally able to achieve this major accomplishment.

Bill allowed me to hold and admire his finisher's medal. It is really something to see. Maybe, if you ask him nicely, Bill will allow you to be able to say that you have actually held an Ironman Triathlon finisher's medal.
